

Waikato Graduate Women Educational Trust

Elizabeth Bisley Memorial Prize in English

This prize was established in 1961, from a fund set up for the purpose, by the Waikato Branch of the New Zealand Federation of University Women, and is continued through funds provided by the Waikato Graduate Women Educational Trust.

The prize is named in memory of Elizabeth Bisley, who was one of the women instrumental in the revival, in 1955, of the Waikato Branch of the New Zealand Federation of University Women, and was the revived branch's first President.

Closing Date: 1 February

1. Recipients of the prize may be women or men who are domestic or international students.
2. The prize will be awarded annually at the conclusion of the academic year, to a student in the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences who has completed at least 60 points in English at 500 level, and is the best graduate student of the year.
3. The prize has a value of \$1,000 and comprises a cheque and a certificate, which will be presented to the recipient at the Trust's annual awards ceremony.
4. The choice of the prize-winner will be made by the Head of Subject.
5. The name of the recipient must be forwarded to the Waikato Graduate Women Educational Trust Awards Committee, P O Box 148, Hamilton 3240 on or before 1 February, annually.
6. If, in the opinion of the Head of Subject, there are no candidates of acceptable standard, no prize will be awarded.
