Emmy Noether Prize in Mathematics

This prize was made possible by the gift of a sum of money for capital investment from the Federation of University Women to the University of Waikato, and is continued through funds provided by the Waikato Graduate Women Educational Trust.

The Prize is named for the German mathematician, Emmy Noether (23 March 1882-14 April 1935), known for her contributions to abstract algebra and theoretical physics.

Closing Date: 1 February

- 1. Recipients of the prize may be domestic or international students.
- 2. The prize will be awarded annually at the conclusion of the academic year, to the best woman student in her first year of study at the University of Waikato, enrolled in at least one paper offered by the Department of Mathematics, and who is the most outstanding first year woman student in mathematics for the year.
- 3. The prize has a value of \$1,000 and comprises a cheque and a certificate, which will be presented to the recipient at the Trust's annual awards ceremony.
- 4. The choice of the prize-winner will be made by the Faculty of Computer and Mathematical Sciences Scholarships Committee (Chairpersons of: Computer Science, Mathematics, Statistics, Graphic Design Coordinator and Deputy Dean).
- 5. The name of the recipient must be forwarded to the Waikato Graduate Women Educational Trust Awards Committee, P O Box 148, Hamilton 3240 on or before 1 February, annually.
- 6. If, in the opinion of the Scholarships Committee, there are no candidates of acceptable standard, no prize will be awarded.
